### *A Time of Discovery*

Ebenezer Scrooge is usually remembered as a miserly, embittered old man even though he underwent a wonderful transformation. In like manner, Lent is too often considered in dark and brooding terms; a time to “give up” the good life and slug through the spiritual mud in an effort to be more Christ-like. To that I say, “Bah... humbug!” I’ll leave Scrooge for another day, but I would like to make a few “positive” suggestions concerning our attitude toward Lent.

It is true that we begin our Lenten journey by recalling our mortality, symbolized by the imposition of ashes; “Dust to dust and ashes to ashes,” as we say. But this is no more than recognizing our need for God and, in recognizing this need, turning to God for companionship along the way. I suggest, therefore, that we look to Lent not as a time of leaving behind or giving up; but as a time of discovery... a time to discover the many reasons we have to be joyful. I suggest, to put it another way, that instead of stripping off the old person, we take on the image of Christ, who is loving, redemptive, creative, and joyful. In your prayers and meditations each day I challenge you to ask God to help you grow into the spiritual being you really are; to take on the character of Christ, and in so doing find joy, compassion, love, and the courage to share these gifts with others.

We’ll do our best to help you along the way. We have scheduled a wonderful array of midweek Lenten activities, which will begin with our Ash Wednesday worship on Wednesday, February 22, at 7:00 PM. Starting the next Wednesday (Feb 29) and continuing through March 28, we will gather for candlelight worship from 7:00 - 7:30 PM, and immediately following I will facilitate a video based Lenten study entitled, *24 Hours that Changed the World*, which examines closely the last day of Jesus’ life, and its significance for us. I hope you plan to join us.

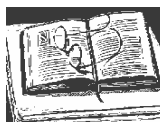

## Stewardship Green Moment

You can increase efficiency and cut costs during home upgrades—there are many ways to do so. You have an advantage if your home was built before the 1950s—the materials used in those homes are more environmentally friendly than the materials developed since the advent of synthetic chemicals. If a home was built with particle board or laminates, it has had a chance to off-gas most of the toxic fumes by now.

Check with your accountant or the IRS to see whether you may be eligible for state and federal tax credits to offset the cost of your energy-saving home improvements. New credits and incentives are frequently available. Sometimes the utility company will even give you a credit if you replace old appliances with more energy-efficient models.

Be aware that chemicals have replaced bacteria and viruses as the main threat to health. Since the later part of the 1900s, one of the major causes of death have been diseases of chemical origin. Therefore, remodeling could not only improve just your home, but also your health.

One of the first things you should do is plan your remodeling project and try to incorporate as many green friendly ideas as you can. Discuss with your contractor how many recycled materials you can use on your remodeling project. Make the room you are remodeling as energy efficient as possible. Use low energy appliances, programmable thermostats, and energy efficient windows. Doing things like this will lower the amount of energy you use and will also lower your electric bill—that will save you money!

Be sure to use paints, woods, and sealants that are non-toxic. Use as many local materials as possible. This will reduce air pollution from trucks transporting the materials due to the trucks' exhaust gasses.
