My dearest OPCC friends and family,

Meeting God at Home: An Altar in the World

In these days when we are longing for community, I trust that part of our longing for community is because we experience God in community. In the absence of gathering as a community in-person, where might we continue to find God's presence? We can all find God right at home, “right under our feet, in the everyday activities, accidents, and encounters of our lives” (pg9). Paying attention to “everyday altars...anything can be a spiritual practice once you are willing to approach it that way – once you let it bring you to your knees and show you what is real, including who you really are, who other people are, and how near God can be when you have lost your way” (82-83).

Through the end of May, our worship experience (whether online or in-person) will be guided by a book by Barbara Brown Taylor, “An Altar in the World.” Together we will look at the ways to see God more clearly in a trip to the grocery store, or in something as common as a toothache. There is no need to do so, but if you are interested in buying the book to follow along, it is available in hard copy, electronic, and audio book versions. If you need help procuring a hard copy of the book due to current circumstances, please contact the church office and we will do what we can to help you.

What's Happening at our Food Pantry?

Yes, we are still providing food to our neighbors and they are so grateful. I have been told by several of our recipients (while masked and gloved) that we are helping to keep their hopes up and bellies full. They recognize that we are learning new ways to care for them and welcome whatever we can provide to them, even if they can't select it themselves for now. There have been so many thank yous and God bless yous as they drive through the parking lot.


How do you provide food while staying safe? It's a challenge.

1. Most of our dedicated volunteers are not able to work during this time, so we have made new friends. Harvesters has a Volunteer Sign Up page on their website and we were able to add our need. It was originally set up to ask for help on our Saturday pantries, but once someone signs up I now ask them about all of our many opportunities to serve at our pantry.
2. Our Board has asked us to add a third pantry (and extra food) this month as a trial to see if we would be able to sustain three pantries per month. Our dates for April are April 14, 25, and 27. This is a challenge, but I 'm sure we can meet it.
3. The challenge required that we place an extra order of food from Harvesters, which meant a crew had to travel to their warehouse at 38th and Topping, KCMO to pick it up. Then another crew joined us back at OPCC to unload the order.
4. In order to maintain social distancing for our distribution volunteers and the recipients, we now pre-package our food. We place the packages into the vehicles. This means we need fewer volunteers at distribution. But, we need another crew to spend time packaging the food.

The extra pantry on April 27 is our new adventure. We will have a more traditional mobile pantry. On the 27th, Harvesters will bring 10 pallets of perishable food (most or all of it will be fresh produce – we won't know until we see it coming off the truck). Our job is to put this food into people's vehicles. Whatever is leftover (ideally none) will need to find a home that afternoon, because, it's perishable. This is a little intimidating, but again, we can meet the challenge.

Tall Oaks Update

Tall Oaks Camp and Conference Center is impacted by the spread of the coronavirus, as we are impacted by federal and local government actions to limit the spread of the virus.

To ensure the safety of our campers, staff, and guests, and to ensure the long-term viability of Tall Oaks Camp and Conference Center, the Tall Oaks Board of Directors, along with the Executive Committee of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) of Greater Kansas City, has decided to *suspend the operations of Tall Oaks Camp and Conference Center at least through July 31, 2020.*

We look forward to seeing campers and guests in late summer, and we are excited about the opportunity we have to improve the ministry of Tall Oaks.

(If you had already registered for camp, a full refund will be issued to you automatically. The refunds will be processed by our Camp and Conference Coordinator.)

Youth Group

Rummage Sale

Like everything else, our Summer 2020 Youth Mission Trip plans are up in the air, but the OPCC Rummage Sale remains one of our most profitable fundraisers for our mission trips. We postponed our March Rummage Sale given current health and safety conditions and will continue to monitor our options into the summer. Ideally we would still love to host a rummage sale, and encourage you to keep those treasures ready for the days we are able to host such a fundraiser, as we will eventually be able to go on mission trips again. We will be sure to communicate new information as it becomes available.

OPCC Coronavirus Fund

The coronavirus has affected us all in many ways as we go about our daily lives. For some, the financial impact has been severe. The federal government has laudably acted to help by quickly sending cash payments to individuals and families. The amounts, while generous, may not be sufficient or timely for some. Others who have stable incomes for which the Coronavirus has not resulted in an immediate need might view this payment as a “windfall”.

To address the needs that do exist, OPCC has established a Coronavirus Fund to provide an opportunity for its members to share a portion or all of their federal payments with those in need. Folks wishing to commit funds specifically to those critically impacted by the Coronavirus may make contributions online on the OPCC website, <http://www.opccdoc.org/online-giving.html>, or by mail to the church office, 7600 W. 75th Street, Overland Park, KS 66204, designating them for the “OPCC Coronavirus Fund”. Donations to this fund will be distributed to those whose needs exceed the federal government funds provided them.

A special committee has been formed to receive requests for funds, evaluate them, and allocate the disbursements. Anyone who would like to apply for these funds, either for themselves or for someone else who needs it, should call the church office at 913-677-4646 or send an e-mail to office@opccdoc.org. Just ask for a coronavirus fund application, and you'll receive a return phone call. Your confidentiality will be respected.

We need to identify families in need now, so that when funds become available, we can immediately meet their needs. Let us share what we can at this exceptional time.

Charter: A Coronavirus Committee and a Coronavirus Fund was established by a OPCC Board Resolution on April 2, 2020.

Background: In a laudable effort to quickly get cash to individuals and families impacted by the Coronavirus, the federal government in March of 2020 announced that payments would be made in the following weeks of \$1,200 per person or a maximum of \$3,200 per family of four. Some of the members of OPCC whose income is stable and sufficient through this crisis may see this as a “windfall” for which the Coronavirus has not resulted in an immediate need.

Purpose: The purpose of the OPCC Coronavirus Fund (The Fund) is to provide an opportunity for members to share a portion or all of their federal payments with those in need. Donations to The Fund will then be distributed to those with needs that may be more than the federal government funds have provided to them.

Giving options: Members wishing to provide funds specifically to those impacted by the Coronavirus can make contributions, designating them for the OPCC Coronavirus Fund.

Of course some members may want to share their federal cash payment with OPCC by simply increasing their regular giving to make up for any shortfall in giving that might occur during a period when Sunday services are not held at the church.

Governing Principles:

The Committee: The OPCC Coronavirus Committee (the Committee) will be comprised of one member from the OPCC Board, one member from the Outreach Committee, and two members at large.

Applications for Assistance: Requests for funds to help specific individuals and families will be directed to the Committee, who will evaluate the requests, prioritize them and instruct the OPCC Bookkeeper to pay funds as available out of the OPCC Coronavirus Fund.

Payment Amounts: At the discretion of the Committee and recognizing that not all individuals and families will receive federal funds (you must file a tax return to get a check and many have income low enough that they are not required to file) the amounts paid will be up to what is requested by the individual or family, or the federal government limits to individuals or families, whichever is less. Should the needs of a particular individual or family continue in the future, after 60 days following the initial distribution of funds, additional funds may be paid to that same family, if funds are available and no higher priorities are identified by the Committee.

Confidentiality: The names of the recipients will be held in confidence, known only to the Committee members and the OPCC Bookkeeper. The Bookkeeper will provide monthly reports to the OPCC Board regarding Fund contributions, disbursements and Fund balance, as well as the number of households receiving payments from the Fund.

Residual Funds: Once the financial impact of the Coronavirus impact is mitigated, as determined by the OPCC Board, any residual funds in the Coronavirus Fund may be distributed to the Pastor's Fund or other organizations or agencies that are continuing to serve the needs of those in need, with a priority for those directly or indirectly impacted by the Coronavirus. At that point the Coronavirus Committee will be disbanded.

Property Commission

Even though the building has been closed, many property activities have taken place, including one important upgrade for the sanctuary:

Upgrade - just before the virus and "stay-at-home", the sanctuary was upgraded with a "hearing assistance system". Progressive Electronics, Inc. installed a control box interface and wireless hearing devices. The hearing devices will be available for use by just stopping at the sound booth as you enter the sanctuary — don't forget to turn it back in after service.

Other Property activities:

1. Edelman-Lyon Co. replaced a control device in the ADA door mechanism and changed two push buttons.
2. Quarterly pest extermination has been completed.
3. Lee replaced the cracked floor tiles in one of Monarch's classrooms...State required this during their inspection of the school just before the "stay-at-home" started.
4. The basement wall repair has been pushed to late April or early May.
5. West hallway floor (in the school) has been stripped and waxed by Superior Floor .
6. This past week Lee found that the HVAC hot water was not circulating. Temperature Maintenance replaced the control panel on the boiler which sends a signal to the valve that lets the water circulate. Still waiting on the invoice for this.
7. Landscaping:
 - a. "stay-at-home" has delayed some of the gardeners from performing all their plans. They are worried that the grounds will not look as nice this year when we all start gathering at the church. Please be patient with them and appreciate what does bloom.
 - b. Jan finished cleaning out all the gardens, trimmed dead out of plants, trimmed the roses and crepe myrtles. Lee has mowed the courtyard three times already!! Since the church is closed, Jan/Lee have felt comfortable about getting out, plus it's been good for their spirits.
 - c. Lee took the mower (which needed the self-propel fixed), blower, and weed eater for service.
