Lines from Laura

Last month we started looking at the stories in our lives and how they impact who we are.

If you had never heard the story of God's creation that says God created the world in love, and that our creator's fingerprint touches everything we see, how might you engage differently with the natural world? If you had never heard of the stories of Biblical families, broken and put back together, strained and strengthened, how would you view your own family when it experiences difficulties? If you had never heard the story of God coming into this world in the flesh and blood of Jesus Christ, how might you approach your own flesh and blood differently? If you had never heard these stories about stewardship, how might you give of yourself to your community and for the common good, or not, in a different way?

We read stories in scripture because they shape who we are and remind us of whose we are. They push us and comfort us, invite us to ask questions, and provide answers we didn't even know we were seeking. We read stories of the faithful because they are the stories we want to shape us as followers of Christ. The best stories captivate and transform us — they change how we live.

On Election Night, November 3, 2020, Overland Park Christian Church participated in an Election Night Communion service along with all the other Disciples of Christ churches in Johnson County, KS. One of the preachers spoke of Romans 12:1-8, reminding us to "not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God — what is good and acceptable and perfect." Because whether it was 2000 years ago, or 2 days ago, the stories of this world have the capacity to shape us if we read into them more than the stories of God. The stories of God tell us that no matter who lives in the White House, we are going to take care of the homeless, take care of those who are hungry, take care of those who are on the margins, and speak up and make space for those who feel voiceless, or whose voices are silenced.

As we consider the stories of the world these last few weeks, we have also been invited to remember, release, and reimagine our own stories — more specifically, our own money stories. This week and the next we are invited to restore and rejoice in the stories of God that we might live into them as we are called by God. We have been, and will continue to be, intentionally direct — naming exactly what we're talking about and not skirting around it. Money and possessions are one of the most common topics in scripture, and Jesus talked about money more than faith and prayer; our money story is a spiritual story. So, too, did Jesus talk about how leaders in the community (elected or not), leaders in the synagogue, and those who followed him, all engaged with the wider community and with one another, especially with those pushed to the margins. No matter what story of the United States unfolds in these coming weeks, we will keep centering ourselves in God's story, and rejoice in the Divine guiding our narratives.

The OPCC Board and COVID-19 Committee both recognize that this has been extremely hard to keep our community connected during the pandemic over that last several months. Although nothing is without risk, we will take advantage of temperate weather as long as it lasts with our in-person, outdoor, masked, socially distant gathering for prayer and meditation offered in addition to our Sunday morning virtual worship (online and over the phone at 10:30am on Sundays). COVID-19 is still considered in an “uncontrolled spread” in Johnson County, and your personal risk factors have not changed, so please remember that when deciding if it is right for you to attend this prayer service.

Anyone who is not experiencing symptoms, and who has not been exposed to another COVID+ individual is invited to join us for an outdoor prayer service on Sundays at 4:00pm in the OPCC Courtyard. We are finding that we still have plenty of space, so please come right at 4:00pm on the Sundays you want to join.

Please read the covenant of participation before considering whether this is right for you and your family. This covenant includes things that are very familiar to us these days: masks, social distancing, temperature checks, and symptom free, etc., but it is important that everyone read it!


Winter Weather & Closings

You can even call in as many times as you would like to listen to the service again. The worship service remains up until Saturday night when the audio switches to the new Sunday worship audio. Though there are minor differences accounting for visual vs. auditory worship, the audio is the same music, message, and more each week, continuing to connect us no matter how we worship!
