The scriptures and stories from this year's Lenten season offer us narratives of the apostle Peter, a very normal human being, trying to figure out what it means to follow Jesus – just like us. Faith is a constant journey of steadfast pursuit, one that ebbs and flows. In Peter, we see a disciple that keeps going: he drops his nets, he walks on water, he runs to the empty tomb, he swims to the shore to meet the risen Christ. He keeps searching and yearning and loving,

even after missteps or mistakes. Ultimately, in Peter's story, we are reminded that God loves imperfect people – with a *wandering heart* – in fact, time and again, that's precisely who God claims and calls.

Please continue to join OPCC as we follow Peter's *wandering heart*. We, too, are binding our own *wandering hearts* to God, this Lenten season. Whether in prayer practice, book study, Sunday worship, or more – YOU are welcome, and invited to this journey of faith!

#### Songs of Loudest Praise | John 12:12-16

As Holy week begins, Peter is no longer front and center, and so we imagine he is with the rest of the disciples when Jesus enters Jerusalem on a colt. The disciples are confused as they witness crowds shouting hosannas. When they look back on this experience, they will remember the songs. The singing is surely etched in their memories. As we imagine ourselves in the crowd on this day, may we remember that they are supposed to be praising Caesar, but instead they are shouting for the one entering the city on a donkey. Their singing is subversive, courageous, and contagious. Their praise shows the ripple effect of public displays of praise.

#### Prone to Leave the God I Love

All are welcome to CPCC at 6:30pm for a special Good Friday Worship in the OPCC Sanctuary, as we encounter Jesus and this day in a new way. On this Holy day, we are paying close attention to how Peter acts in Jesus' final hours. So much happens in a short amount of time: Jesus predicts Peter's denial, soldiers come and Peter draws his sword, Jesus is arrested and Peter denies him, Peter denies Jesus again and again and the cock crows, then Jesus is crucified and dies. Peter is prone to mess up, to fight, to deny, to leave, to seek safety for himself. But aren't we all? May we lament all the ways we are prone to leave the God we love.

#### And I hope | Luke 24:1-12

We might expect that, after denying Christ, Peter would cower in shame—or perhaps even run away in an attempt to leave his past behind him. Instead, when he hears the news from the women, he doesn't dismiss them like the other disciples. He gets up and runs to the tomb. When he peers into the empty tomb and sees the linen cloth, he is filled with awe. Even after the biggest failures, even after the worst case scenario has happened, can we run toward hope? Like Peter, will we keep going? Will we keep looking for God in our midst?


#### Thank You Rev. Chuck!

## Please mark your calendars for OPCC's next IHN Host Week April 7-14th.

Our last rotation of IHN was January 21-28th. We housed 2 single females and a grandfather with 4 grandchildren. They were wonderful guests and our volunteers provided hours of time and lovely dinners to support their stay.

For those who remember our guests of the past rotation, please join IHN in celebrating the graduation of Riley (25). Riley was able to move into housing with a friend last March1st. Finally, Ramiro and his four grandchildren are moving closer to housing. The greatest challenge for Ramiro is childcare. He is well connected to the social worker homeless liaison for the Olathe Schools. Heather and Marilyn (our IHN social workers) have worked together to assist Ramiro, however, the schools have had unplanned closures which has made it more challenging for Ramiro.

Reporting on new guests, the IHN family grew by five on March 1st with the admission of a family of four, as well as a single female. Please join us in welcoming Staci (44), Daniel (47), Grace (14), and Patrick (11). Daniel has a long military background, and the family is receiving supportive services. In addition, please join us in welcoming Alex-Andrea (30). She is working full-time and is five months pregnant.

As of today, with the five new recent admissions, our IHN Family has now worked together to lift up 912 individuals. Of those served, 523 are children under the age of 18, and 100 are single unaccompanied female guests. Our family has worked together to provide 58,806 bed nights and 176,408 Meals. Please always know, 523 are little souls that would have gone to bed hungry, and not had a place to lay their head at night.

As you can see, our IHN population is consistently fluctuating with the needs of our guests. If you are not a volunteer and would love to join the number of people who assist our guests, please contact Barb Collins for training opportunities. Not only do our guests receive care and support from you, but you will receive an uplifting experience that will be even more meaningful for you!

### OPCC Food Pantry

### Church Music History Moment

Several people have commented how they enjoyed learning about singing different lyrics to familiar hymn tunes, so here is a little more information about early practices.

Many of the American Colonists from the 1600s were illiterate, so scriptures were passed through oral tradition. One of the ways this was accomplished was by writing the psalms into metrical meter that could fit familiar tunes. When singing these "hymns," folks would sing without instruments using a method known as *lining out*. The song leader would speak a line of text, and the congregation would echo back the text to using each line of the selected tune. Through this method, common people were able to memorize scripture.

Remember that it's never too late to join us in Reverberations Bell Choir and/or Chalice Chancel Choir on Wednesday evenings.
