### *Lines from Laura*

Dearest Friends...

Eight years. I have had the privilege of gathering in celebration of God's love, with you, for eight years. We have seen God work for eight years at healing, comforting, and renewing a church. People baptized. Marriages begun. Marriages restored. People being healed. Followers of Christ taking ownership of their faith in new ways. Children born and growing up, people finding their way back to God, a celebration of seventy years of ministry, and a GLOBAL PANDEMIC. I truly thought celebrating 70 years of ministry with you was a highlight – but to do it during a global pandemic, and to celebrate your commitment to one another and to Christ – what a light in this world! It has been such a privilege to have a front row seat to this story as your pastor.

There is a concept in the Old Testament known as the Year of Jubilee, built in as a celebration and rest and freedom in the seventh year. As OPCC has celebrated its tenth jubilee in 2020 (7x10), and as I have celebrated ministry with you for these 8 years, this image of jubilee has been at the forefront of my mind, recalling what good it is that God sees in a time of jubilee. After a good deal of conversation and seeking wise counsel, the OPCC board has granted me a 3-month sabbatical, or time of jubilee, as outlined in my covenant of work. This will be thoughtfully designed for rest, spiritual renewal, and seeking wisdom for what is next, together.

From June 11 – September 6, I will be relieved of all official OPCC roles and responsibilities. The OPCC Board (in partnership with staff and our Regional Minister) are working on the specifics of what that will look like during this sabbatical and will communicate those plans in as timely a manner as possible. But have no fear! What we know at this point is that a sabbatical minister will be hired and will lead OPCC through these months until I begin to worship with you again at the beginning of September. The goal for all of us, myself and OPCC, is to discern what Jesus is saying about our future, and be faithful in what we do about it. At the end of this sabbatical, I will return to OPCC and together look toward OPCC's next 70 years!

Some of you may remember that during the summer of 2015 Pastor Bo and his wife Christina also had the privilege of taking a 12-week sabbatical for rest and renewal. Whether you were present for that experience or not, I trust there are some questions that still linger as OPCC embarks on these three months of jubilee. I want to address those questions or concerns that you may have and invite you to speak with myself, or with any of the staff, so that you feel informed and comfortable. Even the greatest, most exciting changes can bring stress and questions – so feel free to ask and seek support from us!

### What is a sabbatical?

A sabbatical for a minister is a time for rekindling their sense of calling, for growing in one's knowledge, and for deepening one's spiritual life. It is a time for renewal and refreshment for those who serve others. It is also a time for a congregation to rediscover its own resources for leadership, and to be renewed itself as a result of the sabbatical. Sabbaticals are scriptural, practical, and test in a way few things can, the mettle and unity of the congregation, while producing healthy results for pastors and congregations.

### What is a sabbatical NOT?

Sabbatical is NOT a time to for YOU to take a vacation from worship, or the church. We've been apart for far too long at this point – we hope to see you soon! No matter what, OPCC will be here doing some awesome things – worship, ministry, outreach, fellowship – and you certainly don't want to miss out on that! Sabbatical is NOT a time to worry about the leadership of the church. A part-time sabbatical pastor will be hired, and Rev. Chuck will also continue to lead worship and work with our youth, children, and families. Our musicians will still enhance worship and create new spaces to experience God. Our front office and administrative staff and volunteers will all still be here; pastoral care and small groups will still continue to love and support our members. Our elders and deacons will still provide leadership, and the church will continue to be about our entire family in faith, not just about one individual.

While the scope and details of the sabbatical are still being worked out, we wanted to share this announcement with you right away. Please know that you can contact me about any questions you may have, about concerns, and hopes you have for this time of jubilee, both for the congregation and for me. I am excited about this opportunity as we will all continue to learn and grow together as we follow Christ and grow closer to God with you and one another!

No matter our in-person worship options, we will continue to offer our worship experience online, and are always looking for more ways to “bring it home” to you so that you still feel a part of our wider Christian community. As stated in the **OPCC Returning to In-Person Community** article, the month of April will keep us connected with ONE worship video. Once we have an updated timeline of our live-streaming equipment we will be able to update you more with virtual worship moving forward. For now we will continue to stream the videos on Sundays at 10:30am on Facebook, on our Worship This Week page on our website, and on our Sermon-by-Phone number (913-299-9002).

You can also view these services anytime after they go live, and you can listen over the Sermon-by-Phone until the next week's worship experience is loaded. The worship order is available each Sunday on our Worship This Week Page on our website. Please comment, or send an email to let us know you are “with us.” Even if you think “oh, they know we're watching,” we're not 100% sure how many watch each week – so a comment on the video, or an email to the front office each week is extremely helpful ([office@opccdoc.org](mailto:office@opccdoc.org))!

## OPCC Returning to In-Person Community

We celebrated new life on Sunday, April 4 celebrating Resurrection Sunday, *and* we celebrated new life with a “watch party” to view the worship video in our sanctuary! This is JUST THE BEGINNING of what it looks like for OPCC to return to in-person community, fellowship, and worship. We’re intentional to NOT use the words “re-open” because we’ve never been closed. Our worship, community, fellowship, education, and growth has continued no matter what – and will continue; that is the life of a community of faith!

Throughout the month of April, at 10:30 on Sunday mornings, we will host “watch parties” so that you can watch the worship video from wherever is most comfortable for you: in-person in the sanctuary with a mask, at home on your computer or TV, or over the phone. The in-person watch party will watch the same video as those who are watching from home. This practice will continue through April for two reasons: it keeps us connected as community, experiencing the same worship; and it gives your staff the space, time, and grace to adjust worship as needed until we are fully in-person. Our hope is that we can continue like this until our new live-streaming equipment is up and running!

Your OPCC Board has identified a group of people who are monitoring all the necessary precautions needed as we return to in-person fellowship. This includes individuals involved with a variety of areas in the church, and will help determine what OPCC needs to continue keeping our community safe! More updates will follow as this group continues its important work.

## In-Person Volunteers for Worship Leading

For many weeks now we have invited participation in worship from those who are comfortable recording on video and able to participate in our virtual worship experiences. As we begin to return to in-person worship, we still need volunteers to participate in worship on Sunday mornings, and need to know who is comfortable both being at worship in-person, and reading as part of this worship experience.

Would you be willing to serve as a liturgist and read either scripture or a call to worship provided for you? No age requirement – anyone willing to read is welcome! ## Communion

You should have received individual communion packs in your Lent-from-Home-Kit that should have lasted you through Easter. If you need more for future at-home worship experiences, please contact the church office, or fill out an order form on our website. [www.opccdoc.org/communion.html](http://www.opccdoc.org/communion.html) You will be notified when communion is ready for you to pick up, for your use from home.

If you still have plenty at home, please consider bringing it with you for your use as you return to in-person worship, until it has all been used. We will continue to utilize these individual communion cups for as long as necessary, to continue welcoming all to the table, and keeping us safe while communing with God and one another.



## Baptism on Pentecost

After conversation, the decision has been made to offer baptisms to any child, youth, or adult, on Pentecost, May 23rd! While this remains liturgically appropriate to celebrate the Spirit of God moving in our midst, it also allows for the potential to be baptized in person with our church community present. We of course have no guarantees for when we will resume in-person worship, but the prospect of May 23rd is certainly more likely than April 4th. Any child, youth, or adult who is interested in becoming baptized this Pentecost is encouraged to contact Rev. Chuck or Rev. Laura in preparation for this special sacrament. An 8-session preparation will be offered as we look forward to celebrating these new steps for our siblings in faith! Though it may look and / or feel different right now, a life of faith never stops growing.

#### The Greatest Love

Everyone loves love. We all need it. We all crave it. But what is this thing called love? There are many different kinds of love: love of a friend, parental love, puppy love, romantic love. And love comes in different strengths. There's undying, conditional, sacrificial, and fleeting love. We've all experienced love in a variety of ways, and we know that when it's good, it's very good. But we also know that sometimes it can hurt. Love can let us down.

What we need is love that will last, love that goes deep, love that's expressed by action. What we really need is God's unconditional love. As the apostle John said, "This is love; not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins." (1 John 4:10)

Just think - though we didn't love God, He loved us and acted on that love. He sent His Son Jesus into the world, who died a sacrificial death on our behalf. Jesus was "an atoning sacrifice for our sins," so that all our failures, mistakes, acts of rebellion, and weak expressions of love would be done away with. His death for us is "atoning" because it brings two parties back together after a falling out - namely us and God.  
(See Genesis 3:1-19)

God's love is amazing because it's proactive. It's expressed by action. It cost Him a lot, and it's the love we need. Other forms of love have their place, but nothing less can take the place of His love.  
We need the real thing.

Do you know that God loves you?  
Or do you find that hard to believe?  
Well, it's the truth; and it's been demonstrated powerfully by Jesus. The thing is, love is better when it is not done at a distance. So, will you come near to God and receive His amazing love by repenting of your sins and believing in Jesus?

The Coronavirus Committee has two requests: **First**, if you can afford to share your stimulus check with others in need, you can do so by donating, either on-line or with a check payable to OPCC with Coronavirus Fund in the memo line. **Second**, if you know someone for whom their stimulus check will not be sufficient to meet their current needs, you can sponsor them by calling our receptionist Eileen. She will refer you to one of the Coronavirus Committee members who will take your information and complete the process. A prospective recipient can also call Eileen directly to make an application.

At last count we have granted over \$30,000 to those in need, and it is making a difference in the lives of many families.
