A New Vision for a New Day

With the addition of Laura (Phillips) to our pastoral staff and the completion of the renovations to our worship space, we have arrived at a significant point in the life and ministry of our faith community, and stand before the most important question of our day. That question is this: what vision of ministry will guide us into the future God has in store for us?

It is a new day in the Church at all levels: in our congregation, our denomination, the Protestant Faith in its many manifestations, and the Church universal. As we are so keenly aware, this new day is not exactly a cakewalk. Gone are the days when all we had to do was hang up a sign, open the doors, and show a little neighborly spirit to get folk and to spare into our fellowship. We have reached a point at which our faith traditions are on the outside looking in on a culture that pays lip service to them, but really has no use for them.

I rehearse this situation not to frighten you, but to underscore the need for a new vision of ministry to guide us into this new day. The old has passed away, and we need to discern the vision God has for vital ministry into the future. And make no mistake, God has such a vision; we must summon the humility and spiritual maturity to discern it, and the spiritual courage to live it.

Over the next few months we will engage fully in a visioning process that will help us discern God's vision for OPCC. We introduced the process before Christmas with a month long study of churches that faced situations similar to ours, and how they decided to address them, and a discussion of how we might learn from their experience as we begin to address our future. Now it's time to shift into high gear with prayer, small group discussions, conversations with the community around us, and the discernment of a new vision for our ministry in this new day. Information on times, schedules, goals, and activities will be publicized in the near future. In the interim, we encourage you to commit to be a part of this important process, and to begin to pray daily for the life and ministry of OPCC. God has great things in store for us, and it's the right time to latch on to that vision and give it arms, legs, minds, and hearts in the days ahead. Look for more information soon.

Sanctuary Rededication Sunday, February 23 @ 9:30 AM

We will rededicate our newly renovated worship space during morning worship on February 23. This will be a joyful time of celebration and consecration. We will celebrate the completed project so long anticipated; and we will consecrate ourselves as a faith community to the purpose for which it was undertaken: to share the joy of faith, to grow in our spiritual lives, and to reach out to our community with a heart felt invitation to join us on our spiritual walk.



The Worship & Arts Commission has appropriately chosen to designate this day "Bring a Friend Sunday"; or "Each One Bring One Sunday" ...whatever you want to call it, it will be an opportunity to focus this day on the purpose of our renovation rather than on the space itself; to focus on our commitment to share the joy of faith with more and more people. Together Center Closed

For many years, OPCC has helped to support the Together Center, at 10th and Forest. The Regional Board voted in December to close the building in which Together Center and First Christian of KCMO had operated. This decision was made because of a long list of deferred maintenance resulting in city citations that would have required funding from the Region. Together Center is not operating at this time. First Christian and the center have not yet announced whether they will continue meeting elsewhere, or close. Please keep this ministry in your prayers.

Easy things To Do To Go Green In 2014

- 1. To save hundreds of gallons of water, turn off water while shaving, washing your hair, brushing your teeth, and washing dishes.
- 2. When you run your washer or dishwasher, make sure you have a full load. This helps conserve water.
- 3. You can also save energy by keeping your house well insulated and by using a programmable thermostat.
- 4. Another energy and money saver is to use energy efficient light bulbs.
- 5. Do not buy bottled water. Buy an at-home filtering pitcher and store water in a reusable container (one made of glass, aluminum, or recycled plastic). It takes 1.5 million barrels of oil per year to make bottles for bottled water. Also, you will save money by not buying the bottled water (approximately a \$1400 savings per year).
- 6. Brew your own Fair Trade coffee. Use a travel mug to put it in—thus reducing the waste from cardboard cups and carrying sleeves. Choose a Fair Trade blend that supports farmers. Use a French press instead of a traditional brewer in order to save electricity.
- 7. Take reusable bags to the store. By not using plastic bags, you reduce your carbon footprint.
- 8. Reduce the number of paper towels you use. Buy a few cotton cloths and cloth napkins. These can be put in the wash numerous times and will help reduce the current 3,000 tons of paper towels put in landfills every day!
- 9. If possible, use a bike for short trips (trips of 2 miles or less). This is a great way to increase your fitness level, reduce your carbon footprint, and save money on gas and car maintenance.
- 10. Be a vegetarian on weekends. You can reduce your carbon footprint by 1/3 of a ton a year by not eating meat 2 days a week. Eat fruit, salads, vegetable sandwiches, and vegetarian pizza, for example.
- 11. Convert magazine and newspaper subscriptions to electronic subscriptions. Also, read e-books to help cut down on paper usage.
- 12. Take fewer baths and take quick showers—that greatly reduces the amount of water used. A "typical bath" uses 30-70 gallons of water and an 8 minute shower uses 17 gallons of water.
- 13. Use a power strip so that you can shut off your computer, TV, radio, etc. at night. This saves on the use of phantom electricity.
- 14. Shop at local farmers' markets. This helps the environment and the farmers. Plus, you get fresher food at a cheaper price by doing this.

The bottom line is for 2014, reuse, recycle, and reduce energy consumption. Happy New Year!
