## **Prayer During Lent**



# Our Harvesters' BackSnack Program Makes a Difference

## **Weekend meals for hungry children**

**EVALUATION RESULTS FOR 2012-2013 SCHOOL YEAR** 

Since its inception in 2004, Harvesters' BackSnack program has grown from 30 students to 18,210 students in 2012-2013. For the 2013-2014 school year, Harvesters will provide backpacks filled with nutritious, child-friendly food to 19,255 children every week. As the program expands, it is imperative that we verify that its objectives are being achieved.

Harvesters hired the UMKC Midwest Center for Nonprofit Leadership to evaluate the impact of the program. Two groups of stakeholders – children and school personnel – were surveyed to determine whether nutritious food impacts program participants in seven key areas: grades, school attendance, behavior, self esteem, responsibility, social skills and health. Results from this evaluation and three previous ones consistently show Harvesters' BackSnack program is achieving its intended objectives, and has a significant positive impact on children who participate.

#### SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- Absences by children for medical reasons were reduced.
- Participants also had 9 percent fewer tardies.
   SELF ESTEEM
- Children report an increase in trying new things, meeting new people and making choices.
- Survey results also indicate a decrease in children getting their feelings hurt.
- Schools report children are friendlier.

#### RESPONSIBILITY

 According to schools, students demonstrate a significant increase in a sense of responsibility over the course of the BackSnack program.

#### **BEHAVIOR**

- Schools report discipline issues among BackSnack participants were reduced by 54 percent.
- Improvements in behavior are statistically significant for those surveyed. Children report getting "in trouble" less.

#### **GRADES**

- Grades improved in all four subject areas studied—math, science, social studies and English. Increases ranged from 12 percent in science to 22 percent in English.
- Children report it is easier to work without help, to understand their teachers and to understand their homework after participating in BackSnack. Results from schools confirm this.

#### **HEALTH**

- Schools report visits to the school nurse were reduced by 10 percent.
- Visits to the school counselor or social worker were reduced by 19 percent.
- Children say they enjoy eating the food in their BackSnacks because it is healthy.

#### SOCIAL SKILLS

 Teachers say students' social skills significantly improve after the BackSnack program. They are friendlier, respectful, responsible, well behaved and participate more in class.

OPCC volunteers add fresh items to the Harvesters BackSnacks and deliver them to East Antioch and Tomahawk Elementary Schools every week.

Our Food Pantry, which is stocked mainly by food purchased from Harvesters, is held at OPCC the second Tuesday evening and the last Saturday morning of each month.

# 🍌 Stewardship Green Moment

## **Green Moment for April**

Using commercial cleaning materials can produce harmful fumes, can be toxic (even fatal if ingested by a child or a pet), and can often leave a residue that can get in the body through the skin. It is really safer and more environmentally friendly to concoct your own cleaning solutions. These cleaners are called DIY (Do It Yourself) cleaning products. This article will explain how to do this.

- 1. Diaper Pail Deodorizer: use 1 cup of baking soda and add 1 teaspoon of your favorite essential oil and mix well. This mixture should be sprinkled in the bottom of the pail, then put in the liner. When needed, repeat this procedure.
- 2. Bathroom Air Freshener: Buy a one pound box of baking soda and add 20 drops of essential oil then place it under or very close to the toilet. Refresh when necessary with more essential oil drops. Once every 3 months, replace the baking soda with a new box of baking soda and add the essential oil (20 drops). Use the old box of baking soda to make other DIY cleaning products.
- 3. Mold and Mildew: Mix equal parts of white vinegar and water and put into a spray bottle. Add drops of your favorite essential oil to the spray bottle in order to leave a fresh smell. Another "recipe" for mold and mildew is to combine ½ cup of hydrogen peroxide and a cup of water—place in a spray bottle and spray the problem area. Wait an hour and then wipe down the surface with a rag. To clean grout, make a paste of equal parts of distilled white vinegar and Borax. Apply to areas that are moldy or mildewed and let stand an hour before wiping the areas down.
- 4. Wood Furniture Polish: Mix ¼ cup vinegar, ¼ cup olive oil, and 10 drops of lemon essential oil. Pour into a spray bottle.
- 5. Window Cleanser: Mix 1 cup water, 1/8 cup vinegar, and 10 drops of lemon essential oil. Place in a spray bottle.
- 6. All Purpose Cleanser: Mix together 2 cups of hot water, 2 tablespoons of vinegar, 1 teaspoon of Arm & Hammer washing soda, ¼ cup liquid dish soap, and 20 drops of your favorite essential oil. Place the mixture into a spray bottle.
- 7. Drain Cleaner: Pour ½ cup baking soda down a stopped-up drain, then pour 1 cup distilled vinegar down the drain. Wait 15 minutes and then pour 4 cups of hot (not boiling) water down the drain.
- 8. Toilet Bowl Cleaner: Mix \( \frac{1}{4} \) cup baking soda and 1 cup distilled white vinegar. Pour mixture around the bowl and let it sit for 15 minutes, then scrub and flush.
- 9. Carpet Cleaner: For carpet odors, sprinkle the carpet with baking soda and wait an hour, then vacuum. For fresh grease spots on carpeting, dust generously with corn starch, wait 15 minutes and then vacuum. For carpet stains, mix equal parts of vinegar and water. Pour mixture into a spray bottle and spray it on the stained area and then wait 15 minutes. Use a brush and soapy water on the stained area.
