## *Imagine a World with More...*

The church – both this church, Overland Park Christian Church, and the church universal – the church is in a season of imagining anew how we do ministry, worship, care for one another, and connect with our communities in impactful ways. We are imagining what it means to be God’s people, to study scripture, to proclaim the resurrection of Jesus Christ in this new world. Often our communities get caught in a vision of scarcity—what if there is not enough? What if we are not enough?

Instead, what if we imagined a world with MORE? What if we imagined a world in which God’s love was limitless? A world where there was more hope, more love, more connection? What would our communities look like? How would they feel? Who would be changed in a world with more? What would be transformed? For the next four weeks during worship we will imagine a World with More... invited to see God’s love as the limitless and abundant force in our world, or the world we want to create.

In her 2022 State of the Church address, our General Minister and President, the Rev. Teresa “Terri” Hord Owens shared, “God’s imagination is so limitless that we are called to continually move the stake. We can’t think of anything beyond what God can accomplish. And if we don’t believe that, I always say, if we don’t believe that God can do exceedingly and abundantly as Ephesians tells us, all that we can ask or think, we might as well hang it up right now. First Corinthians 1 tells us that God’s foolishness is wiser than human weakness and God’s weakness is stronger than human strength. A later part of that verse in the King James says that God uses the foolish things of the world to confound the wise.”

These next four weeks of worship will help us explore what our world might look like with more of the church in it. More of the church’s expansive love. More of the church’s radical hope. More of the church’s deep compassion and commitment to justice. And not just the more of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), but more of your community doing what it does best and revealing God’s limitless love in your community. These next four weeks are an invitation to imagine what God is doing and what God could do in our community and beyond. I hope you will join us!

- August 14 – Imagine a World with More Community (Acts 2:42-47)
- August 21 – Imagine a World with More Hope (Hebrews 10:23-25)
- August 28 – Imagine a World with More Justice (Isaiah 58:6-9)

  - The choir generally sings in worship two Sundays a month, as well as at the Christmas Eve service.

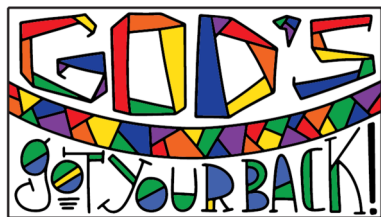

Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood. That's why OPCC is on a mission to help save lives by hosting a blood drive. The community is invited to take part in this special event and donate blood for hospital patients in our neighborhoods and across the nation. The need for blood is constant, but only 3 percent of the U.S. population donates. By rolling up a sleeve, donors can play a critical role in the treatment of accident and burn victims, heart surgery and organ transplant patients, and those receiving treatment for leukemia, cancer or sickle cell disease. A blood donor card or driver's license, or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are at least 17 years old, weigh at least 110 pounds, and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood.

## Food Pantry- Did you know?

- \* Over 65,000 people in Johnson County are food insecure. (Food insecurity is defined as not knowing where the next meal is coming from.) That's 12% of the population of Johnson County. (source: Food Policy Council of Johnson County)
- \* Why don't they get a job? About one half of our guests are retirees, trying to live on their social security. Approximately one fourth have a physical or mental disability and have limited abilities to work. The rest are generally people that have a job but for a variety of reasons their income doesn't stretch. (source: our stats)
- \* Another way to think about this is the living wage chart. This has been calculated for Johnson County, KS. A living wage is defined as the hourly pay rate to have basic housing and needs met and off of public assistance.
  - 1 adult and 0 children:
    - Living Wage = \$17.21 per hour
    - Poverty Wage = \$6.19 per hour
    - Minimum Wage = \$7.25 per hour
    - Base Social Security Pension = approximately \$5.91 per hour
  - 2 adults and 2 children:
    - Living Wage = \$25.21 per hour
    - Poverty Wage = \$6.37 per hour
    - Minimum Wage = \$7.25 per hour

- \* But don't they get food stamps? (SNAP Benefits) 99% of our pantry guests do not receive SNAP because they make too much money to qualify, or because they own their home. (source: our stats)

## Responding to July Flooding

*Living in covenant with the people of God*

At the end of July, St. Louis endured record-breaking rainfall and massive flooding. At the same time, in eastern Kentucky, 8 to 11 inches of rain fell in just 48 hours, devastating communities that are still recovering from last year's record flooding.

Since the news of these storms, Week of Compassion has been in touch with Regional Ministers and local church pastors of Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) congregations. Early reports are that 3 church buildings in the St. Louis area have been damaged. Several member families in eastern Kentucky have been affected. Week of Compassion is also working with our ecumenical partners in the affected areas to provide safety and shelter. These partners are preparing for long-term recovery in these communities.

# Property Commission

Late June and all of July has been a very busy time for the Property committee. See listing below:

- a. During the second week of July, Temperature Maintenance made OPCC staff very happy and cool by installing the new air conditioning coil in the air handler which cools the offices.
- b. Temperature Maintenance completed their quarterly inspection and maintenance of all the HVAC units throughout the entire building.
- c. After the above quarterly maintenance, the drain line to the air handler above the Great Hall got plugged up causing the pan to overflow and soaked 9 ceiling tiles. Richard Owens cleaned up all the ceiling tiles and sucked up all the excess water from the carpeting. Lee replaced all the ceiling tiles this past week.
- d. Boiler was inspected by the State Fire Marshal's office and annual certificate has been received.
- e. Lee repositioned the Emergency Fire Department box outside the front doors so the O.P. Fire Inspector could access it without using a tall ladder.
- f. Augustine Exterminators did their quarterly service.
- g. JP Company has completed the installation of an emergency door exit within the lease space for Honey Bee as required by the State Fire Marshal.
- h. Lee planed the top and side of door to Room 43 during IHN week.
- i. We are in the midst of replacing two short exterior stair hand rails and one long exterior ramp hand rail on the West side. The two short stair rails have been installed and ramp rail is still being fabricated...installation coming within the next two weeks.
- j. Dave Farley is coordinating getting bids to have gutter covers for the front of the church and the Memorial Garden area. This will eliminate our church gentlemen from climbing ladders to clean out the gutters twice a year. More on this next month.
- k. Richard Owens scrapped off paint from a window in the Great Hall and repainted the window frame. He also installed vinyl over the kitchen sink cabinet flooring. Thanks, Richard!
