Dare to Dance Again

For many years as a child, I participated in dance classes. I trust I am not the only one within our congregation who did the same; I know some of us still take lessons, even today! Whether you took dance classes as a child, as an adult, or not at all, you don't have to have taken lessons in order to know the freedom of dancing (especially the freedom of dancing when no one is watching)! Each of us as our own "groove." What's yours? Head-bopping? Hip swinging? Shuffle? Slide?



The Easter season is all the weeks (and Sundays) that follow Easter, through to Pentecost, and it is a time of 'coming out of the tombs.' Tombs of death, economic loss, grief, world war, and unrest, can be obvious challenges we face as a community. Yet some tombs we need to emerge from are of our own making and we ask ourselves, "what holds us back from claiming our freedom to really LIVE and to dance fully, while being our whole selves?" No matter what confines us, the Easter message is one that offers the courage for new starts, and new movement.

Gene Kelly sang, "the sun's in my heart and I'm ready for love," as he danced in the rain. Nothing could 'dampen' his spirit. Indeed it is still daring to dance when pain still exists in the world. Yet, when we dare to dance together in spite of the pain, we proclaim our readiness, courage, and celebration of the love that has, and will, get us through.

No one will make you dance in worship if you don't want to, but we hope you will join Sanctuary (9:30am) and Broader Way (11:00am) worship gatherings in April and May as we "dare to dance again" as a community of faith. When we put one foot in front of the other, in the presence of other daring dancers, we will be empowered by the spirit of new life found in this Easter season!

Church Music History Moment

Here's another music history tidbit about the use of hymn tunes (such as the ones we used for "Come, Thou Fount") in early America: To elevate the quality of singing in churches of that day, traveling teachers would move from town to town and hold a singing school teaching all ages of people to sing 4-part harmony using hymn tunes. No instruments were used because the voice was considered the only sacred instrument. The book containing the tunes was appropriately called The Sacred Harp. In place of lyrics, the singers sang the music using the syllables of do, re, mi, fa, so, la, and ti. Remember Maria in The Sound of Music? The notes were different shapes to aid in identifying which syllable to sing, so the method was called shaped-note singing.

Fantastic Worship Opportunities with OPCC

Beginning in 2023, through these last several months of 2024, our entire church, guided by the leadership of our elders, and board, have been discerning how we continue to live out our vision that was established in 2014: **Overland Park Christian... Re-Visioning Church - Valuing, Affirming & Serving with Heart,** as well as our *five core values* at the center of who we are as a congregation:

- Authentically living in hopeful expectation
- Serving with Heart
- Intentionally valuing and accepting everyone
- Lovingly embracing social, spiritual, and cultural diversity
- Focusing on that which unites us

From these TEN all-church gatherings offered in early 2023 *four missional priorities* emerged. These priorities were discerned by our elders in July 2023 based on congregational responses to missional planning gatherings, and these priorities will continue to guide the ministries of OPCC through the rest of 2024.

- Exploring worship opportunities that speak to a broader audience
- Exploring the relationship and partnership with Broadway Church (DOC)
- Growth of our community: both individual growth, and growing our community of faith, through invitation and opportunities
- Maintaining a Social Justice focus that moves from education to ACTION!

As these missional priorities have been, and will continue to be our focus for how we act as the Body of Christ in our little corner of the world, it is with *great excitement* that I share with you some **new opportunities that will begin on Sunday, April 7**.

- 9:00 a.m. Coffee Fellowship & Nursery Care Opens Coffee fellowship will take place in The Fireside Room, and our nursery is staffed in Room 41.
- 9:30 a.m. Sanctuary Worship This worship will take place in the sanctuary and include contemporary and well-loved music, woven into a traditional liturgy format that includes songs, hymns, sermon, The Lord's Prayer, communion elements, Children Worship & Wonder, and more. We will continue to be creative in our exploration of God's word, in a worshipful, sanctuary setting.
- 10:30 a.m. Coffee Fellowship continues in The Fireside Room
- 11:00 a.m. The Broader Way Recognizing there are "broader ways" to commune with God, this worship will take place in the Fireside Room around tables. Knowing that many of our neighbors and community might have a complicated history with "church," and now consider themselves "nones or dones," The Broader Way gathering will include elements of fellowship, conversation, worship, song, a light meal, participation for all ages, and the love of the God.

It is our expectation that each of these gatherings will be unique enough, that some may choose to attend both on a Sunday morning. Others may find a rhythm of one worship gathering or another, yet we will also all continue to be community *together* on the 5th Sunday of those months (June 30, Sept. 29, Dec. 29 in 2024), and on "high holy days" like Easter, Pentecost, and Christmas.

We share this news with great thanksgiving to Broadway Church (DOC) that saw OPCC and our hope to speak to a broader audience, communing with God in innovative and invitational ways. This visible hope inspired the financial gift that will make The Broader Way feasible for at least two more years.

I continue to be so proud to lead such a loving, and transformational community of faith. Overland Park Christian has continued to inspire me, as we listen for where God is leading us, and looking "outward" to what might speak to those not already stepping foot in our building. I continue to sing our praises that we want to welcome a diversity of experiences of God, and grow together through community, education, service, and worship, as we have grown with, and because of one another these last 70+ years.

Thank you for continuing to commit to your growth as a disciple of Christ, and as a Disciple of Christ. We continue to grow closer to God, as we grow closer together in holy community! I look forward to seeing you at one of these gatherings, very soon!
