Turning the World Upside Down

The late writer Madeleine L'Engle wrote a book about the Christian season of Lent called *The Irrational Season*, in which she attempted to make sense of a church year that had fallen on hard times. Given the context in which we now live, she might well have written a book with this suggested title: *The Irrational Teaching: Reflections on the Beatitudes*. Whenever we hear the Beatitudes, how often are we struck with their poetic beauty, yet at the same time, overwhelmed by their perceived impracticality for the world in which we live? Surely, we admire the instruction, but how often do we fear the implications of putting the words into practice?

Living in a time when the "blessings" given seem to be only to those who succeed, often at the expense of others, to be "poor in spirit," peaceful, merciful, and meek will often get you nowhere in a culture grounded in competition and fear. As Charles James Cook, professor at the Seminary of the Southwest says, perhaps this is why most references to the Beatitudes imply that in giving this instruction, Jesus was literally turning the values of the world upside down.

During the remaining four weeks in October, you are invited to join Sunday morning worship as we take a "deep dive," into these nine blessings and what they mean for our lives. Rev. Emily Stirewalt will lead us in worship on Sunday, October 8, and then Rev. Laura will return to spend the remaining Sundays in October on this important part of the gospel.

The Beatitudes ~ Matt. 5:3-12

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek,

for they will inherit the earth.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness,

for they will be filled.

Blessed are the merciful,

for they will receive mercy.

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers,

for they will be called children of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted

for the sake of righteousness,

for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people revile you and

persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account.

Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

What's Your Story?

We just concluded seven weeks of focusing on the twelve (thirteen) disciples that follow Jesus, and the stories of how they each came to know him, and share his story after his death. Thousands of years later, as those who follow Christ, each of us also have a story to tell. Our congregation has a story to tell, and so, too, do each of us as individuals have a story to tell, about how we see God working in our lives. Sometimes these stories are dramatic – like Saul's conversion to Paul on his way to Damascus – while others are filled with everyday experiences of Divine presence, so robust that we can't help but want to give thanks to God.

As OPCC has committed to prioritize the growth of our community, both as individuals and as a community, we invite you to tell your story, because each of these narratives contribute to the significance of who we are as Overland Park Christian. What better way to help our community grow together, than to tell one another about how we see God working in our lives?

Sometimes it can be intimidating to share our stories of those of God's work in our lives, perhaps because we feel like we don't know the right words, or the exact ways to describe the experience. Yet, none of us need to have all the answers in order to connect with one another. We can each share what we know best, that being your own story, and in so doing participate in inviting others to know the love of God-in-Christ in new ways each day.

You will notice over the next several weeks that we have members and friends of OPCC to share their story of God's love in the world, during the Invitation to Discipleship, during Sunday worship. Some of these stories might surprise you, some will feel familiar. Some might not be anything like your own relationship with God, while others will inspire you to deeper relationship with God-in-Christ.

As you hear these testimonies of how God is at work in the world, you, too, are invited to write a paragraph telling a story of God at work in your life. If you would be willing to share your story during a worship service, or here in the OPCC Scene, we'd also love to keep our congregation growing, by hearing how God is working in one another's lives. If you're willing to share your story during worship you can reach out to Rev. Laura, or if you are willing to share your story in our OPCC Scene, then you can reach out to Michelle Reiter for next month's OPCC Scene.

Thank you for being part of this story of God, here at Overland Park Christian Church, and sharing your story with us.

September proved to be a very busy month for Property. Let's first look at many bills that came in September for work done in August but not received before the September Scene was sent out.

- 1. Temperature Maintenance:
 - A. Main chiller high pressure control needed repair and reset
 - B. Built a new drip pan for the Fellowship Hall air handler
 - C. Cleared the drain line to air handler for the kitchen
 - D. Quarterly maintenance of all HVAC equipment
 - E. Repairs for leased spaces:
 - a. Classroom chiller needed resetting for tripped phase protector
 - b. North classroom air handler needed a new phase protector with auto reset
 - c. South classrooms air handler needed a new blower motor and capacitor

September activities:

- 1. Broadway Church moved into OPCC
- 2. Lee cleaned out behind the fridge and stove in kitchenette so the new appliances from Broadway could replace them
- 3. Lee replaced several fluorescent light bulbs throughout the building
- 4. Lee repaired a toilet in the school area
- 5. Richard Owens painted one wall in both the Bell and Choir rooms. He is currently sanding and painting the three Northeast exterior doors.
- 6. Property has contacted Edelman-Lyon to replace 4 transmitters and 2 receivers in the ADA doors at the front entrance
- 7. Landscaping has been cleaning out the gardens and set up a Fall display in the Trinity Garden.
