Reinventing Church? This Is No Radical Idea

Last Sunday (September 28) we took a bold step in our commitment to God's vision for our future as a faith community. We voted (96 for, 10 against) to sell the north property to our neighbors, the First Assembly of God, thus helping to provide for the transition time ahead of us, and (importantly) keeping the property in service to God through God's church.

When the decision was made decades ago to purchase the entire property from 74th to 75th street, it was envisioned as a general investment in the future of OPCC and its ministry, an investment that would prove invaluable when the time was right. It might have become the foundation for a gym or family center at some point; it didn't. It might have become the home of OPCC's unique drive-in worship service as Forrest (Haggard) dreamed; it didn't. Instead, it was available at this moment in our history, when its support of our ministry will truly be invaluable. Those on whose shoulders we stand did not specifically envision this use of the property, but I am convinced that this is the right time to put it to use (Paul would say that the time is ripe or full; nurtured by God for this precise moment).

That confidence doesn't make the decision any easier, however, and I know many of you feel a strong connection to that parcel of land. It feels integral to our identity as a community of faith. For your courage to make the decision we are grateful; and that gratitude will guide us as we determine how best to employ this blessing from God.

It will of course benefit our efforts to live into God's vision of our faith community, and the steps through which we will reinvent church; at least this one faith community. To reinvent church in this instance, however, does not mean to start over from scratch. Nor does it mean that we will sever the bonds with our history. I have mentioned before that I struggled for some time to recognize what was new in this vision as I read over the core values that have guided us, and will continue to guide us into the future. My eureka moment came when I recognized that what is new in this vision is our *intention to cast off any limits* on these values, and to learn in spades what it means, for example, to embrace diversity, and welcome all in God's love.

In addition, we live in a radically changed cultural situation in which those outside the faith community do not readily embrace our tried and true methods from the past. Recognizing this doesn't imply a criticism of what we have been and done as a faith community – far from it – it simply means that we must *look for new ways, effective in this moment, to share the good news*, and to offer these marvelous core values to our larger community. To reinvent church in this sense is not a unique and radical idea; rather it is the approach to our vision and mission we are called to live day-by-day, month-by-month, and year-by-year. God's Church will remain viable and effective only as it continually reinvents itself to reach the broader community in each unique historical moment. This is our moment, and I pray we will prove faithful to the task.

October Green Moment

Here are some ideas for going green at Halloween:

- 1. Instead of handing out candy, consider handing out things likes pens, pencils, small toys, or homemade treats. If you truly want to hand out candy, check <u>www.naturemoms.com</u> as this site offers links to many organic candies, lollipops, and other healthy treats.
- 2. Offer your kids a candy buyback. Have them pick out their very favorite treats to keep and buy the rest back from them. For example, you can give them ten cents a piece for each piece of candy they "sell back" to you.
- 3. Start a "costume swap" with family and friends. Offer to trade costumes you and/or your kids wore the previous year that are still in good condition for costumes your friends and/or their kids have worn. You can host the swap of costumes in your home, or by an e-mail chain, or by using social media sites to offer what you have and to browse for what you want. This saves you money as well as keeps the costumes out of the landfills.
- 4. Shop for costumes and accessories at thrift stores, flea markets, or garage sales. You can repurpose old items into something new and different and this not only gives you a "new" costume, it also saves you money.
- 5. If you do purchase decorations, buy just a few things that you really like that are sturdy and wellmade—things that can be used more than one year. Purchasing cheap items that fall apart quickly is wasteful. For outdoor decorations that can only be used for one season (like pumpkins, hay bales, gourds, and mums)—visit a famers' market or pumpkin patch. If you want to make ghosts, cut an old white sheet into 6-8 pieces and use cotton, material scraps. or rags in the top and string or twine around the neck—then hang the ghosts close to your front door or in trees in your yard.
- 6. Have the kids use a sturdy reusable shopping bag or a pillow case to collect treats in—these can be used for more than one year and thus prevent waste. If you want to buy a "special" Halloween bag to collect treats, buy it AFTER Halloween (if possible) and you can get it for 50%-75% off. Make sure it is sturdy so that it will last for more than one year.
- 7. Save costumes, accessories, bags, and decorations from year to year. Keep them in a clearly marked box or storage container and they will be ready to use each Halloween season.

By following these ideas, you will be able to save financially and environmentally.
