## A Star in the Eastern Sky

"Where can we find and pay homage to the newborn King of the Jews?
We observed a star in the eastern sky that signaled his birth.
We're on pilgrimage to worship him."

— Matthew 2.2 (The Message)

A star in the eastern sky; that was all the Magi had to go on when they began their arduous journey. A star in the eastern sky; a glow on the horizon, a vague but growing sense that something auspicious was in the offing, though it was still far off. Had they been familiar with Isaiah, they might have been reminded of the promise from God he was known for back in the day, "I am about to do something brand-new. It's bursting out! Don't you see it?"

A star in the eastern sky; it represented their guide, their growing hope, and their courage. Following the star, they eventually made their way to Bethlehem and the holy crèche in which they found, at long last, the Christ child. And it all began with a star in the eastern sky.

We will soon start our Advent journey, and it will be surprisingly similar to the pilgrimage undertaken by the Magi so long ago. We will begin our journey to Bethlehem on the strength of a glow in our heart that will become a star; a star we can follow all the way to our journey's end, the birth of the Christ child yet again in our life. From there, who knows? Perhaps this Christmas experience will shape our future. Perhaps it will reveal a journey that has only begun, and will lead us into the world with comfort, hope, and good news. Perhaps, in short, it will fuel the revitalization of ministry we have undertaken, and guide us on our way.

Such is my prayer for this Advent season; that we will see clearly the vision and ministry God has mapped out for us, and summon the courage to live into it. At some point in the future perhaps we too will look back on the journey and say, "it all began with a star in the eastern sky. Won't you join us – beginning on November 30, Advent 1 – as we follow this star?


# Family Ministry



## Going green for Thanksgiving

- Plan to use local and seasonal products when preparing your menu.
- If you wish to reduce your carbon footprint, prepare a vegetarian dinner.
- If you plan to have turkey, buy a free-range, organic turkey.
- 4. Host a potluck dinner
- 5. To be energy efficient while cooking, use slow cooker recipes.
- 6. Prepare a thorough shopping list.
- 7. Take reusable shopping bags with you to grocery shop.
- 8. Shop at grocery stores close to home and also buy food at local farmers' markets.
- 9. Use the most direct route to the store and/or farmers' markets.
- Carpool with family and/or friends to go grocery shopping for Thanksgiving dinner.
- 11. When cleaning your house for guests, use non-toxic cleaners such as baking soda and water.
- 12. Light unscented beeswax or soy candles to save energy—this also creates a warm, festive ambience.
- 13. For centerpieces, use live plants or herb bouquets (like lavender or rosemary). Decorate your house with pumpkins, gourds, pinecones, acorns, and fall fruit.
- 14. Use real dinnerware, glassware, utensils, cloth tablecloths and napkins.
