How does a weary world rejoice? An Advent series in Luke's Gospel

While the rest of the world seems to jump into Christmas celebrations the day after Thanksgiving, or even on November 1, in the life of the church we attempt to distinguish this lead up to Christmas, and the Christmas season in separate ways.

*Advent* is the traditional season of the church year in which Christians around the world spend the Sundays prior to Christmas preparing for birth of God into our world, yet not only as a tiny-babe. While we are certainly remembering that amazing event of God coming as a human being, we also remember the ways that God's people were waiting with anticipation, wonder, and yes, weariness, as they waited for God's messiah to come as salvation for a broken world, some 2000 years ago. As we too are looking for God's presence in our world, we remember the ways that it has sometimes felt missing, or absent, perhaps leaving us weary.

These first weeks of Advent we've been pondering an answer to this question, "How does a weary world rejoice," knowing that we will rejoice when we celebrate God's incarnation on Christmas day. How did the world celebrate Christ's coming the first time, despite such brokenness and weariness? How can we too, rejoice, at seeing God's presence in the world, again despite such brokenness and weariness?

We hope you will travel with us these remaining weeks of Advent before we *begin* the Christmas season December 25 – January 6, and join in worship, prayer and study. I look forward to continuing being with you either in person or online as we welcome the Christ child into our hearts and homes on Christmas morning, and beyond.

# During Advent

TWO in-depth and interactive Advent devotionals, and TWO Advent calendars are available at OPCC for all of us to "dig deeper" into "the reason for the season" as we prepare our hearts and minds for the coming Christ. You can choose all four of these resources, or just one, taking as many copies as you need for yourself or to share, as we can always print more of each of these resources.

Advent Devotionals — You are invited to pray individually, but together as a community. Each devotional provides a daily activity to read, or respond, to scripture, poetry prayers, visual art, reflections, and meditative prompts for this season of waiting (perhaps in weariness). Take either version of these devotionals for yourself and your family, or whoever might like to participate in this special time.

Advent Calendars — Take one, or both, of these family-friendly Advent calendars for a map of action prompts to guide your family through this season of waiting, through the month of December.

### Christmas Eve Worship

OPCC will offer two opportunities to worship on December 24. We hope you will make one of these services a part of your family's plans on Christmas Eve.

- \* At 10:30am we will offer a Candlelight Christmas Eve Worship with scripture, hymns, and readings as we welcome the Christ Child with one another. We will join with Broadway Church (DOC) in the sanctuary as we welcome the Christ Child, together.
- \* From 4:00pm – 6:00pm OPCC will offer "Come and Go Communion," where you will be welcomed to light a candle, receive communion, and take a few moments to spend in contemplation and prayer. This year we've added a NEW prayer journey suitable for all ages that can take as much or as little time as you have. Come and go as your schedule allows from 4pm – 6pm.

Please join us for either or both of these opportunities for worship to celebrate the coming of Christ.

### Advent Book Study The First Advent in Palestine

As members of The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), when we approach scripture, "we are called to study and read scripture for ourselves. Rather than having tests of faith and creedal statements, we critically and thoughtfully study scripture, taking into account the history and background - the context - in which it was written." (Taken from the Identity Statement on the disciples org website)

This Advent as we prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of God, we will seek to understand the context of those who experienced the first advent of God-in-Christ — those who "had to travel through great darkness to reach the hope that the shining star announced."

Using the book "The First Advent in Palestine" by Kelley Nikondeha, there will be two opportunities to return to this context of the first advent. Both gatherings will use the same material for study and conversation. You DO NOT have to purchase the book, though are invited to do so. OPCC can also assist in this purchase for anyone, if needed. Come on Tuesdays at 6:30pm in the Fireside Room, OR virtually on Thursdays at 12:00pm by Zoom.


