Hope in Hospitality

Since 2014, OPCC has been intentional in discerning how we live out our mission as God’s church, and in particular, we have focused on how we steward the gift of our amazing building and property here at 75th and Conser. **During that 2014 visioning process, it was made clear that OPCC wanted to stay in this neighborhood, and steward our building to further God’s reign in our community, also allowing us to stay in our building and worship as we desire.**

Subsequently we have engaged in tenancy partnerships with several communities, sharing space, grace, and ministry with Iglesia Rios de Agua Viva (RAV), Homeschool Christian Academy, Church World Service, The KC Region of the Christian Church (DOC), Monarch Montessori, Advocacy in Motion, Case Management Services, Emerson Hartzler’s Financial Management Services, and Honey Bee Community Services. This is of course *all in addition* to the ministries facilitated by OPCC members and friends, such as the OPCC Food Pantry, Interfaith Homeless Network, OPCC Men’s and Women’s groups, youth group, Children Worship & Wonder, *and* all the community groups that use our building throughout the month, such as 12-step recovery groups, the HAM radio club, PEO and DAR groups, and more. **All of this responsible building stewardship has allowed us to continue worshipping as OPCC, and to not only manage, but share, the amazing gift we have in our building.**

It is no surprise, then, as Broadway Church (DOC) was discerning their own future in late 2022 and early 2023, they saw OPCC as a hopeful collaborator in ministry because of our significant hospitality, and so approached us with a proposal for future partnership as [we first shared with in the May 2023 OPCC Scene](#). In concert with this proposal from Broadway Church (DOC), OPCC has been in its *own* [Missional Planning conversations, activities, and prayers](#), throughout 2023, culminating in two meetings on July 9 and 10, of the OPCC Elders and OPCC Board, to refine the priorities of our congregation through the end of 2024. After reviewing all the information, comments, thoughts, and prayers received at the missional planning gatherings in the first half of 2023, the following four priorities of Overland Park Christian, became clear:

- Exploring the relationship and partnership with Broadway Church (DOC)
- Exploring worship opportunities that speak to a broader audience
- Growth of our community, both individual growth, and growing the membership of our community of faith through invitation and opportunities
- Maintaining a Social Justice focus that moves from education to ACTION

Following the refining of these priorities, the OPCC Board approved a proposal that was *sent back* to Broadway Church (DOC), that included their renting space from OPCC through the end of 2023, along with intentional discernment about what future partnership will look like. On August 16, Broadway Church accepted that proposal and indicated to OPCC that they would like to rent space from us beginning in September, through the end of 2023, along with engaging in intentional discernment activities and conversations about what partnership will look like. This intentional discernment will allow both OPCC and Broadway congregation members and leadership to get to know one another even more, and to discern specifics about finances and personnel. This will all include leadership and direction from our Regional Minister and President, Rev. Bill Rose-Heim as we together consider the hope we find in radical hospitality shared with one another.

Broadway Church (DOC) will rent one office from OPCC and then share communal space, in the same way RAV, Honeybee, CMS, AIM, and Monarch pay for their own exclusive space, and then share communal space, together as the calendar allows. Broadway Church will worship at 11:30am on Sundays in the Fireside Room, to honor that unique way of worshiping in discussion around tables, and OPCC will continue to worship at 10:30am in the sanctuary in the same manner we have.

We know that moving forward in hopeful expectation involved a lot of patience, and trust. Like Thomas, we might even have some doubts. Yet no matter what, we continue in hopeful expectation because we know God is guiding us, and leading our faith community into a future with hope.

What is it to Live Forever?

For our early ancestors in the faith, living forever meant having progeny -- bearing children so that your name would “not depart from the earth.” Eternal life was through your “seed.”

Scholars believe that after the exile, a notion of the soul came to believe that the soul could live on after death, and some believed in the possibility of resurrection, where not only the soul would live on, but the body as well would enter into some kind of afterlife.

There are many thoughts in the world about afterlife, whether we are on the great wheel of karma, or whether we meet Peter at the pearly gate, or whether our children are our way to live on. The Apostle Paul considered the afterlife a mystery and a blessed hope. And many of us simply understand that the gospel is much more about “Thy Kingdom come, on earth . . .” than trying to get into some afterlife eternal real estate.

No matter where you land on these thoughts of what it means to “live forever,” one very practical and gospel way to live on is through legacy giving. A legacy gift continues our influence, our intentions, our goals and our values even after we have crossed over into the mystery. It funds “Thy Kingdom come, on earth . . .” Even after we pass on, we live on.

Churches that encourage planned gifts often can provide ministries that “non-legacy giving churches” can only imagine -- youth programs, lecture series, mission trips, facility upgrades and repairs. Overland Park Christian has continued through many tumultuous financial years, *because those before believed their love could live forever, through OPCC in some way.*

As we continue in our missional planning for the present and future of OPCC, may we be aware of the gifts from so many faithful people before us who sacrificed, gave, and passed to us this amazing church. As we receive these gifts, let's be willing to match their faithfulness and generosity so that folks fifty years from now will be blessed by the generous faithfulness of our time in the life of the church. Legacy giving is one faithful way of living on.
